I would like to thank all the NASA member who voted in our recent election. As you probably know the officers are the same all the incumbents won. I thank you for my votes. I will do everything I can to uphold the by-laws and promote scale modelling.

Our membership has grown a great deal this past year. I attribute some of it to our social media site started by John Boyko. John ran with this idea and serves as the moderator. Another factor I believe is that our members have a growing interest in participating in scale competition. As we add Scale Open contests around the country it is easier and closer to travel to these events. All of these events will add competitors to our year end event the NASA Scale Classic in September. A site has been selected and will be announced after the details are complete.

Please don't forget the NASA airplane raffle. This year we are giving away a Hangar 9 Corsair with a Saito radial gas engine, complete Futaba 14SG radio and top of the line Futaba servos, A123 batteries and switches from Electro Dynamics. Tickets are available on line and at the indoor shows coming up. NASA will have a booth at the WRAM and Toledo shows. The plane will be on display there and tickets sold there. The plane was built by John Boyko, Carl Handley and me in the Monster Hangar. It is complete with ordinance and ready to fly. I would like to thank Horizon Hobbies for the plane and engine donation. I would also like to thank Hobbico and Futaba for all the servos and the 14SG radio. Electro Dynamics and Andy Low donated the A123 batteries and switches. If you see these vendors at the up coming shows stop by and thank them for their commitment to helping NASA promote scale modelling.

To make it easier for all our members to purchase tickets on the exceptional airplane I will be sending each member 7 tickets. You can buy them yourself or take them to a club meeting and sell them to your buddies. Tickets are \$5.00 each, 3 for \$10.00, or 7 for \$20.00. The value of the plane and accessories is well over \$4500.00. As you know all proceeds from this go to fund the AMA Nationals Scale Competition.

But wait there is more to give away. This year for our control line friend, John Brodak, has donated \$250.00 worth of merchandise. This will also be part of the raffle given away at the National Scale Banquet on Saturday June 25, 2016. Thank you all for your help in this NASA fund raising activity.

12 INCHES TO THE FOOT - REMEMBERING MIKE GRETZ

Where to start. Well it's a new year and so far I've heard nothing but bad news.

All of aeromodelling lost one of it's best and brightest members last week when Mike Gretz passed away. Mike had a short illness with cancer and it took him, early in the new year.

I've known Mike for many, many years and he was always encouraging, positive and excited about spreading model aviation to as many people (especially kids) as possible. There is a biography of Mike on AMA's website under Hall of Fame members. Besides all of the stuff listed there including being a 7 time Team Manager for our FAI Scale team and being on the team 5 times, Mike was an engineer for modelling kits at SIG Manufacturing. That company has been blessed with a huge pool of talent over the years and always at the forefront was Mike Gretz.

Some of the items you may or may not know that are attributed to him include: most of the instruction manuals over the

past 20 years or so, the SIG CA hinge, and the SIG 1/4 scale J-3 Cub kits. After Claude McCullough passed all of the SIG brand ARF's were directly the result of Mike's work. This is just a tidbit of the contribution Mike gave the aeromodelling public worldwide. Mike raised the bar on ARF quality, he stretched and fed the imagination of many modellers in all segments including F/F, C/L and R/C at trade shows and events around the country.

Many of you may not know that Mike was President of the APM (Air Power Museum and Library) which has the largest collection of catalogued books, magazines and other manuals etc. for civil aviation and all of aviation in the world. Mike was very active in the Antique Airplane Association and their Fly-In each Labor Day week. If you haven't been there, you've missed a jewel of an aviation event. Each year Doris, Mike's wife and he would work at the Fly-In with many of it's members, for what is probably the 2nd largest civil aircraft fly-in in the USA, next to Oshkosh.

Mike researched as much information on record flights and Charles Lindbergh as anyone I know and had a wealth of information on Lindbergh. Other than aviation we talked about fishing both here in the states and in Canada. He loved to go to Canada each spring on fishing trips to some of the best lakes in southern Canada.

Another bit you may not know about Mike is that along with Shawn Elliot of the Experimental Aircraft Association, they founded the EAA's KidVenture program which introduces youth to model airplanes.

Each year this program has grown and changed with the times and has allowed participants to experience flight with CL models as well as FF models and other modes of flight, all geared to children.

It was tough writing this, I wish his wife well and hope we can all support his family during this time. I'm sure others will add to this too here in the newsletter. But I feel it's the least we should do. We've truly lost a treasure of a human being this year.

There's a full-scale runway for R/C competitors and paved surface for C/L competitors. Hangars will be available for aircraft storage. Also, there's a restaurant on site and lodging is located just across the street. Oh, and there's plenty of room for campers.

ON THE CONTROL-LINE SIDE

Last year was the first NASA Scale Classic held in Lexington, KY., and we on the C/L side of this great event cannot wait for the 2016 version. NASA C/L Open contests this year will be: the Brodak fly-in in PA., the AMA Nationals in Muncie, Dayton, OH., and St. Louis, MO. There may be more added later pending sanctions.

Winter is building season in most parts of the U.S. and I have been told there are several new projects on the building board. I have been working on a C/L 1/2A profile scale C-47 with a wingspan of 33 inches with two Brodak .049's for power. While pondering how to mount the tanks a thought came to mind - magnets. After fitting them in place I was surprised at how secure the tank was. Now I don't know if this application would work for larger aircraft but it seems to fit the bill here.

Working with Tony Stillman at AMA, there in now a C/L scale contest board in place with C/L scale builder/pilots as members. In most cases we will control and regulate our discipline. In the past pilots wondered why non-C/L scale people made decisions on rules for our event.

The names of the board members will be made known by AMA soon. This is a great move forward for C/L scale.

FCM, in partnership with John Brodak have added a prize to the NASA raffle, a \$250.00 gift certificate for Brodak merchandise. Check out the information on the NASA web site about the 2016 raffle.

It's hard to imagine we are approaching another Nationals. 2016 scale will be a little different than past years.

#1. The last Brodak Fly-in will be the week before the Nationals and some competitors cannot do both. John has ran this for 20 years and is calling this one the last one. With that being said (Lord willing) starting in 2017 he will replace it with a C/L scale contest only. Stay tuned, for this may become a major scale contest.

#2. AMA worked hard to schedule this year's Nationals and C/L scale will not be with traditional C/L week. However, we are already working on 2017 to come back to the C/L week. We know there are scale pilots who fly in other control-line events and this year will be challenging for them.



2017 will have a new event director, Robert Hayward from Dayton, Ohio. John Brodak and I have ran this event for 6 years and we know Robert will do a great job.

Keep abreast of new oncoming information on the NASA web site, as we'll post new information as soon as it happens.

The 2016 C/L scale season has many contests coast to coast and more coming on board. Come join us, whether 1/2A, team, or something in between. Don't forget the NASA Scale Classic, September 23–25 in Waynesburg, PA.

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


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
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
